Introduction

Assembly Bill ("AB") 1505 was signed by Governor Newsom in October 2019, and as of July 1, 2020, made significant changes (in *bold italics* below) to the charter authorization process, including the following provisions as codified in California statute. While the Legislature approved these new criteria, they did not provide definitions or more specific information on factors to be considered under each criteria. As a result, each charter-authorizing entity must determine what factors to consider.

Education Code section 47605(c), provides that the governing board of the school district shall grant a charter for the operation of a school if it is satisfied that granting the charter is consistent with sound educational practice and with the interests of the community in which the school is proposing to locate. The governing board of the school district is also required to consider the academic needs of the pupils the school proposes to serve.

Education Code section 47605(c)(7), provides that a charter petition may be denied if the charter school is demonstrably unlikely to serve the *interests of the entire community in which the school is proposing to locate*. Analysis of this finding shall include consideration of the *fiscal impact* of the proposed charter school. A written factual finding under this paragraph shall detail specific facts and circumstances that analyze and consider the following factors:

- The extent to which the proposed charter school would substantially undermine existing services, academic offerings, or <u>programmatic offerings</u>.
- Whether the proposed charter school would duplicate a program currently offered within the school district and the existing program has sufficient capacity for the pupils proposed to be served within <u>reasonable proximity</u> to where the charter school intends to locate.

At its July 28, 2020 meeting, the SDUSD Board adopted a resolution (http://go.boarddocs.com/ca/sandi/Board.nsf/goto?open&id=BRLKPQ52DDC9) requiring the Superintendent to bring forward an AB 1505 Implementation Plan within 90 days. The Board requested that the Implementation Plan include stakeholder input.
